# A Guide to Cooking with Beer for Oktoberfest

Oktoberfest officially begins in September and is celebrated in many ways across Houston, including in Garden Oaks. Our local Houston breweries will soon be featuring their best German-inspired brews, ready to be enjoyed at home or out at one of the many local Oktoberfest celebrations.

Now's the perfect time to try out cooking with beer if you haven't already! You may have poured a beer into your world-famous pot of chili or fired up a beer can chicken on the grill, but there are so many more possibilities for incorporating beer into your cooking. Here are some of my favorite ways to prepare food with beer, including a few that might find their way onto the menu at Plonk! Bistro during Oktoberfest:

1) Marinating meat is an easy way to incorporate beer into your cooking. Beer is a great tenderizer, and a splash of sweet-ish Pilsner can balance the acidity of certain marinade ingredients, like citrus or vinegar.

- 2) Because stout beer often has chocolate undertones, it's a fitting addition to chocolate desserts. There are plenty of excellent chocolate cake recipes out there that include stout beer, but you can also incorporate stout beer into a boxed chocolate cake mix. To do so, simply swap the stout beer for the milk or other liquid called for by the instructions. Stout beer will add complexity to the flavor profile of the cake, and you can experiment to find your favorite. Rich and creamy stouts, especially those labelled "chocolate stout" or "milk stout" work best for this application.
- 3) A simple beer cheese recipe is definitely one to have in your arsenal. This rich sauce usually starts with a flour-and-butter-based roux with sweet onions or garlic that's thinned with a light-bodied but flavorful beer, simmered until most of the alcohol evaporates, and then fortified with Dijon mustard, cream, and a high-quality cheddar or other melting cheese. Besides the usual pairing with a

soft pretzel, beer cheese can be used on top of burgers, tacos, and eggs, or even tossed with pasta for a spin on your favorite mac and cheese.

- 4) Like wine, beer can be used to steam seafood. Instead of white wine, a light beer can be added to aromatics and herbs to flavor a pan full of mussels, shrimp, or fish that you'd like to prepare using a gentle method that makes seafood difficult to overcook.
- 5) Did you know that IPA complements the flavors of fresh ceviche? Usually, cooking with IPA is something to avoid because the intense bitterness of hops overpowers other flavors and creates an imbalanced dish. However, a splash of bitterness works well in many ceviche recipes. To try it out, prepare your favorite ceviche recipe, allowing the citrus or other acid to marinate the fish until it reaches your desired texture, then drain the acid off and add a splash of IPA for flavor, along with any other herbs or other ingredients you'd like to use right before serving. Don't try this with salmon, as the combination can create a metallic taste, but IPA is a match for many white fish and for shellfish like shrimp or scallops.

Whether you're cooking for an Oktoberfest gathering or just trying out new recipes at home, cooking with beer can be fun, easy, and creative!

# Garden Oaks Civic Club Minutes Deepak Khosla, GOCC Secretary

Tuesday, Aug 6, 2024 @ Great Heights Brewing

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 pm by President Mike Stephens.

Mike welcomed Council Member Mario Castillo as the first speaker and mentioned how reps from both Council Districts C&H had been very proactive in reaching out and helping after the storm. CM Castillo provided an update on the debris pickup that has been backed up for a while. His office is providing extra funds to bring in contractors to speed things up with Garden Oaks being on the priority list.

CM Castillo also mentioned a safety-related initiative started in his district that addresses lower quality of life issues such as homelessness, illegal dumping etc. The office is providing extra funds to HPD so officers can work overtime to get to these reported cases. His office has also started a 6-month paid internship program for district residents interested in a career in city government. Lastly, he mentioned that the company responsible for developing the old Sears property is studying various options to preserve the historical nature of the Sears sign. Requests were made to CM Castillo to also investigate preservation of the tree at the old bus stop/Sears signage, and regular flooding at Graham Park on the corner of 34th and Lawrence in Section 1.

Mike mentioned that District C was teaming with Trees for Houston for a tree care and sustainability event.

The minutes from the June 2024 meeting were approved.

Treasurer Brian Rabe presented the Treasurer's report which now reflects the budget changes approved in May.

Deputy Kelly briefly discussed issues with some wild horses that had to be corralled on July 4th, and encounters with homeless people in the area. She encouraged people to be on the lookout for thieves stealing equipment from workers in the neighborhood, as well as to request vacation watch when leaving for a few days. She also thanked the politeness of people in our neighborhood vs. what she has seen in other areas.

Social chair Emily Stephens reported that the upcoming Azaleas St. Beer & Wine Extravaganza date has been moved to Nov 16. The team is looking for corporate sponsors, table hosts, and a band. This is the largest fund raiser for the Constable Program, and volunteer participation is very much needed to make it successful. Specific details on the types of help needed will be published soon.

Beautification chair Pam Parks next mentioned the large number of incoming questions about cleanup plans for storm debris in the pocket parks, and that there is no clear timeline from the city. She reported that the extra money approved in the new budget was already being used for improving the pocket parks.

The \$25 raffle gift card was graciously donated by Darlene's Flowers & Gifts and was won by Section 1 resident, Suzanne Debien. Suzanne (Central City Air) is also one of our GOCC CommUnity Partners. Thanks to Darlene's and to Suzanne for

their support.

GO resident Alex James next provided a quick update on the ongoing discussions with Centerpoint. He mentioned that Centerpoint had been very responsive to requests and updates during and after the storm. For an upcoming meeting, Alex would like residents to send specific information on what issues they may have seen during the repair activities. He will then summarize and funnel that to Centerpoint so they can provide specific answers in a future meeting. Please send your input to Alex at alex@harryjamesbuilder. com .

GOMO president Stuart Arouty reported good progress with the ongoing restructure. The organization will be putting out a survey soon to all 5 sections asking for input on various topics. The goal is to come up with the best framework for GOMO that reflects the needs and wants of the residents.

The meeting adjourned at 8:35 PM.

# Garden Oaks Creature Report: Yellow-Crowned Night Heron

The joys of living in Garden Oaks include the sights and sounds of the creatures that visit or call GO home. On walks in the evening, you can encounter nocturnal creatures, such as the yellow-crowned night heron. Our last sighting was on June 24th, 2024, in section 3. At each sighting, the lean bird was silently standing in the ditches or easements foraging for food. Their dark coloring enables them to blend easily into the darkness. Spotting them is always a pleasant surprise!

A GO resident of over 20+ years, Cathy in Section 3, reports having seen several birds in the ditches in front of her house years ago on a regular basis.

#### Creature Details:

The yellow-crowned night heron is a species of night heron, and like other herons they have very long legs. They have distinctive yellow crests that give them their name. Their calls are usually a short 'woe' or 'wok' sound. They prefer wet woods and swamps. They nest in trees and use sticks to make their nests. Their diet consists mainly of crabs, fish and sometimes small mammals, frogs, and roadkill. The average life span of a yellow-crowned night heron is 6.3 years.

Official Bird of Houston: Since September 24, 2019!

Status: Not an endangered or threatened species Protection: A migratory bird, protected under the federal Migratory Bird Treaty Act of 1918 Fun Fact: They are known to use tools, such as twigs, to get prey out of hiding places.

# Choosing a Home Generator: Portable vs. Stand-by

# Mitch Weigand

This is our final column on home generators (portable vs. standby) and which would be the right choice for you. Let's take a moment to compare them in several crucial areas:

#### **INITIAL PURCHASE**

**Portable** - Definitely the less expensive of the two. You can buy one that generates 4,000 watts of electricity for under \$600; it will run refrigerator, some lights and a fan.

**Stand-by** - A stand-by generator which can supply 10,000 watts starts around \$6,000. Depending on the size of your home, you may be able to run one of its A/C systems.

#### **FUEL USAGE**

**Portable** - You have a variety of fuels to choose from with propane and gasoline being the most convenient and easiest to obtain. However, you will have to go out and get the fuel from a gas station or hardware store which can be a definite hardship after a major natural disaster. That is, if the fuel is available which it may

or may not be.

**Stand-by** - Attached to your home's natural gas or liquid propane (LP) gas supply, it's always there and immediately available.

#### CONVENIENCE

**Portable** - This kind of generator requires constant monitoring and refilling of fuel. Are you willing to do that at 4:00 in the morning?

**Stand-by** - Within seconds of an electrical outage, stand-by generators automatically supply power to your home and then shut off by themselves when no longer needed.

#### NOISE AND AIR POLLUTION LEVELS

**Portable** - Think of a lawn mower running non-stop outside your window with the noise and fumes it creates. Not an attractive thought.

Stand-by - They do make noise similar to your central A/C sys-

tem's outside condenser but if properly maintained, there are very little - if any - fumes.

#### **ECONOMY**

**Portable** - What you save in the initial purchase is quickly consumed in fuel costs.

Stand-by - Very economical since it runs on natural or LP gas.

#### AIR CONDITIONING

**Portable** - This is asking a lot of a portable generator. You'll need one that can provide at least 10,000 watts to keep you cool plus run your refrigerator and a couple of lights.

**Stand-by** - Definitely the better choice because of their superior capacity to produce the necessary wattage.

Finally, what is my opinion?? Hands down, if you can afford it, get yourself a stand-by generator. I have one that generates 30,000 watts of electricity which will fulfill all of my needs including three A/C systems plus enough power left over to help my neighbors.

But realistically, be ready to spend \$12,000 for 20,000 watts of power. You'll never regret it. For further information, do some research on "home generators" online or go to a home generator store.
