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## GO Registration Drive v. 2.0

September 30th was the end of a registration period for owners in Garden Oaks. Current Property Owners registered at [gardenoaks.org](http://gardenoaks.org) as of Sept 30 have been entered into a drawing for a cash prize of \$250. The drawing will take place at the November GOCC meeting (Nov. 5 at 7:00 PM at the Great Heights Brewing Co. on Wakefield).

This registration effort produced considerable clean up of our registrations and addition of over 30 unique owners. Typical registrations average a few per month. 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# Guide to Cooking with Spices for the Fall

Nothing says fall like the scent of warm spices coming from a simmering pot or an oven filled with fresh baked goods. You may have your own familiar favorites, but here are some tips that might help you integrate spices into your fall cooking in new ways:

- Pumpkin pie spice (also called apple pie spice) is usually made of allspice, cinnamon, cloves, ginger, mace, and nutmeg. These may be used for savory cooking as well. Try a light sprinkle of pumpkin spice on fall root vegetables, or take pumpkin pie spice and add a bit of cumin for a complex, savory seasoning that works well on roast chicken.

- Warming spices like cinnamon are a no brainer for desserts but don't be afraid of adding them to chocolate desserts as well. Try a little cinnamon or a fall baking blend in your next batch of brownies, or sprinkle a little on top of a mug of hot chocolate for a fall-themed update to a familiar favorite.

- Try toasting and grinding your own spices for more intense results. Buying whole seeds and doing a little extra work will take your favorite fall recipes to new heights of flavor. Many familiar spices can be bought in the form of whole seeds at grocery stores and spice markets. Cumin

seeds, fennel seeds, cloves, black peppercorns, and many other spices will offer a lot more intensity and complexity when toasted whole and ground in small batches prior to cooking.

To toast whole spices, place a heavy bottomed pan on medium-low heat and pour spices in a thin, even layer onto the bottom of the pan. Do not add oil to the pan, but do stir the spices frequently as they toast. When the whole spices become aromatic and begin to darken slightly, remove the pan from the heat. Watch carefully as you toast the spices and don't let them burn – the process will not take long.

Do not use a food processor to grind your spices – most spices are too small to be effectively ground by a food processor. Use a mortar and pestle if you want to be traditional, or try a coffee grinder! The coffee grinder will allow you to grind your spices as coarse or as fine as you like, but be sure to grind two or three tablespoons of plain white rice after you are done grinding your spices. This will remove the oils left behind from the spices, which can corrode the blades of the coffee grinder and leave a lingering flavor that you may not want in your next pot of coffee!

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# GO Creature Report: Opossum

A resident creature, the opossum, is hard to mistake. They have long bodies and tails and scurry about with purpose, trying hard to be discreet. When spotted, they freeze, hoping we won't notice while keeping a watchful eye. For years, several neighbors who are their fierce champions hope for a nightly visit. One explains, "They are cute in a unique way, having a face only a mother could love!"  
 Creature Details: Opossums are marsupials, a primitive group of mammals that carry their young in a pouch. They are the largest order of marsupials in the western hemisphere, with 126 species in general. The average opossum lifespan is 4-5 years in captivity and up to 2 years in the wild. With a diet of birds, bird eggs, amphibians, carrion (dead animals), fruits, seeds, and crustaceans, they are not picky eaters. Opossums will live in any environment that has food, water, and shelter, but they prefer forested areas.

Status: Generally, not endangered or threatened

Fun Fact: They sometimes use their tail as a hand. They are North America's only marsupial!

Difference between Opossums and Possums: Opossums are marsupials native to the Americas. Possums are also marsupials but native to Australia and other countries.

Champions of: Pest control (eradicate 5,000 ticks in a season), disease control, waste removal, keeping neighborhood clean

# Protecting Your Air Conditioning System's Capacitors

Because of improvements in technology and the potential to reduce utility bills, many are looking to replace deteriorating central air conditioning systems. When choosing the correctly sized system for your home, bigger isn't always better, nor will smaller be more economical.

Air conditioners (central A/C systems, mini-splits and window units) are rated by the number of British Thermal Units (BTUs) of heat they can remove per hour. Another rating term is ton which is the equivalent of 12,000 BTUs/hour. With Houston's heat/humidity, a rule of thumb is one ton per 400 square feet. So, a 2,000 square-foot house will require a five-ton central A/C system.

In addition to your home's square footage, there are many other factors to consider:

How many windows does your home have? What are the ceiling heights? How airtight is your home? Are there any skylights and fireplaces? How much insulation is in the attic and walls? Is your home shaded by trees? What are the home's building materials and roof construction? How many heat sources such as people and appliances are in your home? What is the typical indoor temperature expected by you? 68 degrees, 73 degrees, 78 degrees?

An incorrectly sized system can cost you

An over-sized A/C system will not automatically provide superior cooling. That's because in order to meet the temp on your thermostat, the system will shut off before it can remove sufficient humidity from the air, resulting in air that's cold but feels clammy to your skin. What's more, the stress of short cycling (too many stops and starts) will shorten the equipment's life and increase your utility bills.

A system that's too small cannot get the job done either. It will run nonstop, trying to keep up with the demands of heat and humidity. This overtaxes your system, resulting in shortened life span and increased energy consumption.

Ask a professional for advice

Your A/C service technician can help by doing a room-by-room load calculation. This heat loss/heat gain analysis takes into consideration all of the above factors and is the best indicator for the correct system size.
